CODING COLLECTIVE AGREEMENTS

WageIndicator.org compiles a global **database of Collective Bargaining Agreements**, which enables web visitors to read the original texts of Collective Agreements and to compare clauses at national and international levels. By mid 2016, more than 500 agreements in 35 countries have been archived, coded and published in their national language. The BARCOM project aims to improve expertise in industrial relations in the commerce sector by an innovative approach to analyse the content of collective agreements and relating this to the sectoral bargaining systems in the 28 EU member states. These agreements are added to the WageIndicator global database, annotated/coded and published full text and on the national WageIndicator websites, if publication is allowed. Agreements are coded for the following topics: Employment Contracts, Sickness & Disability, Health and Safety & Medical Assistance, Work and Family Arrangements, Wages, Working Hours and Schedules, Paid Leaves And Paid Holidays, Job titles, Social Security & Pensions, Gender, Training, and meta data (signatories, duration, and coverage).
